How serious is influenza?

The flu is a highly contagious viral infection that can cause severe illness and life-threatening complications, including pneumonia.

Research has shown flu vaccination to reduce the risk of flu illness by between 40 and 60 percent.

How contagious is influenza?

Studies have shown that influenza can survive for:

- an hour or more in the air in enclosed environments
- more than 8 hours on hard surfaces such as stainless steel and plastic
- up to 15 minutes if transferred from tissues to hands
- up to 5 minutes after transfer from the environmental surfaces.

Adults can be contagious one day before getting symptoms and up to 5 days after becoming ill. This means that you can spread the influenza virus before you even know you are infected.

Immunisation is the best possible protection against influenza and the most important way we can reduce the number of flu infections and deaths.

How does the flu vaccine work?

Recent evidence suggests protection against influenza may start to decrease from three to four months following vaccination.

Influenza viruses change every year because the virus has a unique ability to change its surface structure. This means that even if you had the flu or an immunisation one year, your body's immune system might be unable to fight the changed version of the virus that will be circulating the following year.

Each year, a new vaccine is developed (usually called the seasonal vaccine) and is available for those who wish to be immunised. The seasonal influenza vaccine includes protection against four strains of influenza.

Recent evidence suggests protection against influenza may start to decrease from three to four months following vaccination. Annual vaccination before the onset of each influenza season is recommended. While influenza continues to circulate, it is never too late to vaccinate.

The influenza vaccine cannot give you the flu because it does not contain the live virus. Some people may still contract the flu because the vaccine may not protect against all strains of the influenza virus circulating in the community.



I have had a Covid-19 vaccination, should I have a Flu vaccination?

The flu and COVID-19 are caused by different viruses and so require different vaccines. It's important to be vaccinated against both to protect yourself and your community.

The Australian Technical Advisory Group on Immunisation (ATAGI) advise that you can be vaccinated for COVID-19 and the flu on the same day.

Influenza Vaccine Vouchers

In addition to on-site clinics, AusHealth Work offers influenza vaccine vouchers redeemable at an AusHealth location based in each capital city and also large regional centres. AusHealth also partners with leading national pharmacies for increased flexibility.

Vouchers offer a flexible alternative for clients in remote areas, or where there may be employees on a rotating shift roster, out of regular business hours.

From there, employees can visit the voucher website and book the vaccination time that suits, quoting the unique voucher code.

REGISTRATION

You can register your clinic on-line and provide us with the locations, times and dates you'd like our Nurse to attend. Booking your on-site clinic earlier helps us achieve your first preference for an appointment.

AUSHEALTH WORK MAKES CONTACT

AusHealth Work will be in touch with you to work out the booking details.

Once confirmed, we will email you a confirmation, including promotional material for you to share internally.

An online booking link is generated for you to distribute to your staff so they can book their preferred time online.

CONFIRMATION

The number of people being vaccinated as confirmed by you is what will be charged.

THE DAY OF THE CLINIC

AusHealth would coordinate a private room for your team, and AusHealth Immunisation Nurse will arrive before your clinic to set up. We will vaccinate everyone needed, pack up, safely dispose of sharps, and depart.

All employees who have received a vaccination should remain in close vicinity to the Nurse for 15 minutes post-vaccination in case of any reactions.

AusHealth Work will provide each person with a record of their vaccination and update the Australian Immunisation Register (AIR).

HOW LONG DOES IT TAKE?

Each vaccine takes 2 to 4 minutes to administer. A post-vaccination observation period of 15 minutes is highly recommended.

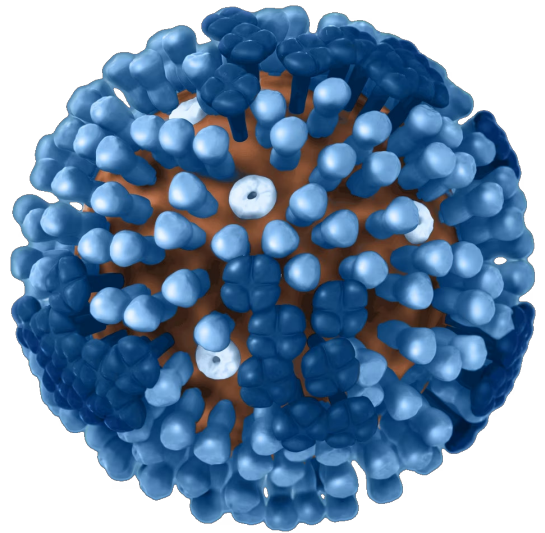

The strains in the quadrivalent vaccines (Influvac Tetra and FluQuadri) provided as part of the 2024 flu vaccination program include:

- A/Victoria/4897/2022 (H1N1)pdm09-like virus;
- A/Thailand/8/2022 (H3N2)-like virus; and
- B/Austria/1359417/2021 (B/Victoria lineage)-like virus



The influenza virus is always changing and evolving. In Australia, a new strain comes out each winter.

Live in Queensland?

All Queensland residents over the age of 6 months can access the influenza vaccine for free in 2024.

Funded by the Queensland government, the 2024 Free Influenza Vaccination Program has now commenced. The Program will conclude on 30 September 2024.

- The 2024 Free Flu Vaccination Program (the Program) will be available to Queensland residents only, including those without a Medicare card.

What does this mean for your business?

- This initiative will enable Queensland businesses to have onsite flu vaccination clinics for their staff at minimal-to-no cost. The cost of the vaccines is covered by the Queensland Government. We charge a small clinic management fee for our time in setting up the clinic with you, but that fee may be waived depending on the number of vaccinations to be delivered.
